Mayor Donovan called the Public Hearing to order at 7:35 p.m. for Local Law #3 for 2007 amending, supplementing and repealing parts of Chapter 151 of the Village of Minoa Municipal Code

A motion was made by Trustee Cronk and seconded by Trustee Champagne agreeing to waive the reading of the Proof of Publication of Public Hearing. All in favor. Motion carried.

**PUBLIC HEARING
FOR LOCAL LAW
#3 FOR 2007**

Attorney Primo provided the overview of Local Law for the Board's review and included a copy of the OCWA Customer Rules and Regulations. He said that Local Law #3 for 2007 is a result of reviewing Chapter 151 titled "Water" and deciding that the section be deleted from the Municipal Code due to the lease agreement contract with OCWA. He

said that the original thought was that the whole section be removed, but included the language reflecting the lease agreement and the Village's intent to furnish an adequate supply of pure and wholesome water to the residents and the businesses located in the Village of Minoa. Attorney Primo said that it also deals with the provisions being deleted and replaced by the OCWA rules and customer regulations, which will be incorporated into the Local Law by reference.

Mayor Donovan said that there is no longer a Water Department within the Village of Minoa, the sections needed to be removed.

Mayor Donovan asked if there was anyone in the audience had any questions regarding Local Law #3 for 2007. Let the record show that no one from the audience had any questions or comments for or against the proposed local law.
