The regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Minoa was held at the Municipal Building in the Village Board Room, 240 N. Main St, on May 24, 2010.

Mayor Donovan opened the meeting at 7:05 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Trustee Cronk.

**MINUTES OF PUBLIC

A motion was made by Trustee Brazill and seconded by Trustee Cronk to accept the minutes of the May 3, 2010 Public Hearing on Local Law #2 for 2010 as recorded. All in favor. Motion carried.

**MINUTES OF VILLAGE  
BOARD MEETING –  
MAY 3, 2010**

A motion was made by Trustee Christensen and seconded by Trustee Cronk to accept the minutes of the May 3, 2010 Village Board Meeting as recorded. All in favor. Motion carried.

**SALES TAX**

Mayor Donovan introduced Onondaga County Legislator Kevin Holmquist and thanked him

for his support in the village's efforts to continue participation in the Sales Tax Agreement with Onondaga County Mayor Donovan said the villages took an approximately a 50% decrease in sales tax revenue, but were still a part of the Sales Tax Agreement. Legislator Holmquist recognized Town of Manlius Supervisor Edmond Theobald in the audience and said that Mayor Donovan and the Onondaga County Association of Mayors and Elected Officials did a phenomenal job in presenting their case to the Onondaga County Legislature. He said that it was a long process and there was little progress towards collaboration, but at the last moment an agreement was made. Legislator Holmquist said that without Mayor Donovan's efforts and contribution, the villages might not have received a portion of the agreement.

Legislator Holmquist provided the Village Board with an agreement approved by Onondaga County that is separate from the Sales Tax Agreement and is **attached hereto as Schedule "A"**. The agreement provides financial assistance for public improvements designed to enhance and promote regional growth, reduce undesirable sprawl, encourage green technology and sustainable growth. The agreement begins in 2011 for a period of 10 years and the Village of Minoa is scheduled to receive 5.51% of the estimated \$4 million annually, resulting in a fixed rate of \$220,400. Legislator Holmquist said that if a village should be abolished, the sales tax funds would then transfer to the Town of Manlius. The new agreement replaces the current Sales Tax Agreement. He said that no future Legislature can adjust the agreement for ten years. Legislator Holmquist said the current agreement allows for the Village of Minoa to receive sales tax revenue based on assessments, but the new agreement does not allow for fluctuation in the assessment values and remains the same. Legislator Holmquist discussed the tentatively proposed Onondaga County tax rates for the Village of Minoa and explained that the reduction of the Sales Tax Agreement revenue would decrease the tax rates assuming that there are no projected revenue gaps in the Onondaga County budget. He said that should the Village of Minoa need to increase property taxes in the future, it should be feasible when keeping in consideration that the Onondaga County taxes would be decreasing.

Town of Manlius Supervisor Edmond Theobald congratulated Trustee Brazill and Trustee Champagne on their successful re-election and the win for newly elected Trustee Christensen, who is filling the remaining term left behind by Supervisor Theobald. He said that his concern was that if the Towns took the credit and they were phased out, then that would mean the villages would be phased out and that is why they fought for the continued participation in the Sales Tax Agreement. Supervisor Theobald thanked Legislator Holmquist for his efforts in fighting for the villages and towns in keeping them as whole as possible. He said that 50% is significantly lower, but they are grateful that it wasn't a complete elimination of the sales tax revenue. Supervisor Theobald said he had heard that there have been resolutions passed by Towns within Onondaga County asking for a change in the Onondaga County government structure, but does not see the Town of Manlius participating in that resolution.

Legislator Holmquist thanked Supervisor Theobald for lobbying for the Town of Manlius and the villages located within. He said that he really went to bat to work closely with the Onondaga County Legislature throughout the process. Supervisor Theobald said that it was a joint effort and he was impressed with the efforts of the Onondaga County Mayors Association.

Trustee Brazill asked Legislator Holmquist if there was anything in place should the sales tax

revenue increase dramatically that would help villages in the future. Legislator Holmquist said that only Onondaga County could re-open agreement if they decided to adjust for unfunded mandates and that it happened previously when they instituted the 1% tax a few years ago. Trustee Brazill said that current revenues have increased throughout the process of the agreement and Legislator Holmquist said that villages should not expect any changes. Trustee Brazill asked if they were expected to keep the gap low and Legislator Holmquist said the County is optimistic that the budget gap remains small and be reduced through the budget process, but could not guarantee a low gap.

Clerk/Treasurer Snider asked if the payments would continue on a quarterly basis and Legislator Holmquist said the payments should continue as usual and the opportunity for early payments could possibly be available by from Onondaga County's General Fund. He said that Onondaga County recognizes a need to be flexible in their sensitivity to the needs of villages.

Discussion ensued regarding the fluctuating Onondaga County budget and unfunded mandates relating to the Department of Social Services and Medicaid expenses, which previously resulted in the 1% increase in sales tax.

Mayor Donovan said that it's vital for municipalities to band together and repeal unfunded mandates such as Medicaid, which is 45% higher than what is Federally mandated. Mayor Donovan said that ten mayors met with County Executive Joanie Mahoney two days before the Sales Tax Agreement was voted on and that their meeting was beneficial in the decision. Mayor Donovan thanked Legislator Holmquist and Supervisor Theobald for attending the meeting and outlining the approved Sales Tax Agreement.

Mayor Donovan said that he had discussed the sidewalk installation for the passive park located in Minoa Farms and the maintenance of the trails with Elliot Lasky. He said Mr. Lasky felt that the sidewalks did not make sense to install, as they were not connected to other sidewalks. Mayor Donovan had asked the Board and Thomas Petterelli their opinions on the sidewalk and they were of the same consensus that it did not make sense to install the sidewalks for maintenance reasons. Mayor Donovan said he had previously polled the Board for permission to discuss the possible purchase by Elliot Lasky for a 4x4 ATV with a box to maintain the trails.

A motion was made by Trustee Brazill and seconded by Trustee Christensen ratifying prior approval giving permission to Mayor Donovan to discuss the possible purchase of a 4-wheeler with Elliot Lasky for the purpose of maintaining the passive trails located in Minoa Farms for the Village of Minoa DPW. All in favor. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Trustee Brazill and seconded by Trustee Christensen ratifying prior approval authorizing Ethel Sawkins, Animal Control Officer, to assume the duties of notifying quality of life issues including, but not limited to, the early placement of trash and brush, basketball hoops in the right of way, uncut grass, etc., throughout the Village of Minoa under the direction of Thomas Petterelli, DPW Superintendent, and be effective May 24, 2010. ### CORRESPONDENCE / RESOLUTION FOR CONSOLIDATION OF ONONDAGA COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Mayor Donovan said the Village of Minoa had received a resolution from the Town of Geddes requesting the Village's support in calling for the consolidation of Onondaga County Government by eliminating both the County Legislature and the County Executive and returning to a Board of Supervisors form of government. Mayor Donovan said the Board had been provided a copy for their review and discussion. No action was taken.

### RFP RESULTS – FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES STUDY

Mayor Donovan said that the Villages of Fayetteville and Manlius received a grant towards the cost of the Fire & Emergency Study. He said the original RFP that was approved by the Villages of Fayetteville, Manlius and Minoa, the Town of Manlius, Town of Pompey and the Kirkville Fire Department was altered to reflect the verbiage required by the grant for a joint fire district. Mayor Donovan said that he was uncomfortable with the proposed study of a joint fire district because it did not allow for alternative options, i.e. combined departments in the north, the south, shared equipment, etc. Mayor Donovan said the Village of Minoa voted on a study that would cover all available options and was agreed upon by the committee after months of meetings. Mayor Donovan said that there were six RFP's received based on the adjusted RFP specifications that the Village Board did not approve before being sent out and asked Attorney Primo for his opinion.

Attorney Primo said that he reviewed the RFP before it was submitted and had recommended that the document not suggest an outcome so that all reasonable options could be reviewed. Attorney Primo said that verbiage was removed that suggested a joint fire district from the RFP and Trustee Brazill provided those comments to the committee members. He said the RFP was reconsidered based on the grant requirements, adjusted and submitted for proposals. Attorney Primo said the RFP's did not come back as originally approved by the Village Board.

Trustee Brazill said he spent a great amount of time working on the RFP and was unaware of the changes made before the submission. He said that he could not approve the RFP's as received because all of the municipalities involved did not approve the changes. Trustee Brazill said the verbiage was changed to meet the grant requirements and understood the need for a change, but the Village of Minoa was unaware of the changes. He said that he wanted a

complete independent study that was not narrowly focused on how to create a joint fire district.

Trustee Cronk said that he had the same concerns and an independent study was needed.

A motion was made by Trustee Brazill and seconded by Trustee Cronk to not accept any of the RFP's as submitted for the Fire and Emergency Services Study based upon the purpose of creating a joint fire district and not an independent all inclusive study, with the willingness of the Village of Minoa to further participation if the verbiage is reverted back to the originally approved RFP specifications. All in favor. Motion carried.

Mayor Donovan said that he would be meeting with the committee and would discuss the Board's resolution.

Trustee Brazill said the Memorial Day Parade preparations are complete and participants are expected to meet at Lewis Park on Monday, May 31, 2010 at 8:30 am.

**MAYOR'S REPORT**

Mayor Donovan said he had spoken to Captain Bleyle to congratulate him on his new position and said he was an active member of the CRC Committee and a huge asset to the Town of Manlius and the Village of Minoa.

Mayor Donovan thanked everyone for their support during the Sales Tax Agreement process. He specifically thanked Clerk/Treasurer Snider and Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Sturick for all of their hard work. He said he wasn't excited about the agreement results, but was appreciative that the villages weren't eliminated from the agreement all together. Mayor Donovan said the agreement would eventually turn into a tax shift with the villages assuming the responsibility of raising taxes.

Mayor Donovan said he had attended the NYCOM meeting with Trustee Christensen. He said they did not receive any good news from Albany and to expect budget hits at the village level.

Mayor Donovan said the Town of Manlius PBA will be holding their 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Golf Tournament on July 30, 2010 and encouraged the Board to participate and support the PBA at their own personal expense.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Chris Beers, 113 Beresford Lane, said there is a lot that sits between two houses where the wood chips flow through to the Minoa Farms park and the lot is filled with weeds and has not been seeded or maintained. Mr. Beers asked what the split was between the Village of Fayetteville and the Village of Minoa for Codes Enforcement services and is the agreement working for Minoa. Mayor Donovan said the split is currently 63% Fayetteville and 37% Minoa based upon time card history. Mayor Donovan said that Fayetteville provides a vehicle; Minoa provides the gas, vehicle repairs and cell phone. He said that Minoa cannot afford a full-time Codes Enforcement Officer and the village is pleased with the services provided by Richard Greene, but additional assistant help is needed to maintain quality of life issues and add value to the village properties. Mr. Beers said that Codes duties have been reduced for the Village of Minoa and will be difficult to get back those services. Mayor Donovan said that Ethel Sawkins will continue as Animal Control Officer, as well as contributing to the Codes department.

Michael Macko asked if the turn signal for Fremont Road and North Central Avenue was still in the process and Clerk/Treasurer Snider confirmed that the Onondaga County Department of Transportation has the project approved and funded.

A motion was made by Trustee Brazill and seconded by Trustee Christensen to come out of Executive Session at 8:39 p.m. All in favor. Motion carried.



RESOLUTION NO. 084

**AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH THE VILLAGES LOCATED IN ONONDAGA COUNTY, FOR THE PERIOD OF 2011- 2020, TO IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM TO ASSIST THE VILLAGES IN MAKING NEEDED PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS**

WHEREAS, a viable and prosperous community rests in part upon the ability of that community to maintain and improve its public infrastructure system; and

WHEREAS, a region's potential for economic development is inextricably linked to the performance and efficiency of the public infrastructure system, including the ability to obtain abundant and clean water, to viably manage wastewater, the ability to rely upon accessible roadways, and the ability to access up to date facilities necessary for development; and

WHEREAS, the villages in Onondaga County are foundational population centers in our community and provide desirable locations for smart and effective future economic growth; and

WHEREAS, given the current fiscal situation and the decreasing availability of financial assistance from state and federal governments, the villages in Onondaga County face severe funding gaps and are unable to continue funding needed improvements to their public infrastructure systems; and

WHEREAS, the inability to properly fund these needed improvements impacts the ability to effectively plan for growth and development in the region, leads to the potential for undesirable sprawl, and inhibits the promotion of green and sustainable growth; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this County to make a commitment to investing in capital expenditures at the village level to effectively plan for regional growth and development and to provide opportunities for shared services among local governments; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Legislature hereby authorizes the County Executive to enter into agreements with the villages in Onondaga County to provide financial assistance for public improvements designed to enhance and promote regional growth, particularly improvements that reduce undesirable sprawl and encompass green technology and sustainable growth; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that said agreements shall be for a period from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2020, and it is the intent of this Legislature to phase in this program such that amounts to be funded through this program shall commence in 2011 at an estimated amount of \$1.35 million, in 2012 at an estimated amount of \$3.2 million, and thereafter at an amount not to exceed \$4 million, with the funds to be divided among each village as follows: Baldwinsville, 13.48%; Camillus, 2.02%; E. Syracuse, 4.80%; Elbridge, 3.04%; Fabius, 0.61%; Fayetteville, 11.07%; Jordan, 2.58%; Liverpool, 7.03%; Manlius, 10.21%; Marcellus, 4.01%; Minoa, 5.51%; N. 
