The regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Minoa was held at the Municipal Building in the Village Board Room, 240 N. Main St, on May 3, 2010.

Mayor Donovan opened the meeting at 7:14 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Attorney Primo.

**MARIA DEMONTE / 517
BAIRD STREET /
DEVERONICA SEWER
LINE YARD REPAIRS**

Maria DeMonte, 517 Baird Street, said that she came to the meeting to let the Board know that Tony and Mary Natale had installed a sewer line across her front property in the right of way to connect to the DeVeronica property located next door on Baird Street. She said that there is an unsafe dip in her property where the land has settled and needs to be filled in. Mrs. DeMonte said that she and her husband had stopped into the Village Office recently on different occasions and had not heard from Mr. Natale regarding the property repairs. Clerk/Treasurer Snider said she left a message for Mr. Natale, but had not heard back from him and was going to send a letter to the Natale's requesting a final invoice payment for attorney retainers and that they contact the DeMonte's to repair the yard damage. Mayor Donovan said that he was unaware of the problem in her yard, but that Clerk/Treasurer Snider would try to contact Mr.

Natale again and let Mrs. DeMonte know the results of the conversation. Mayor Donovan said that he would also contact Thomas Petterelli, DPW Superintendent, to see if there was dirt available to fill in the property.

Mrs. DeMonte said that they had installed the sewer line last fall for an ESM High School construction project and she was not informed that they were not going to continue with the project. Attorney Primo said that the developer had the right to install the sewer line because there was a sewer easement on her property, but he also has a responsibility to repair their lawn per a prior agreement. Mrs. DeMonte said that if they did not correct her property she would contact her attorney. It was agreed that a call and a letter would be sent to Tony and Mary Natale for invoice payment and yard repairs.

Mrs. DeMonte left the meeting after the discussion.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

Trustee Christensen had nothing to report.

Trustee Cronk said that the paving at the parking lot at the Post Office is complete and concrete stoppers would be installed.

Trustee Brazill said he was working on the Memorial Day Parade and that Jeff Chrissley will be the public speaker. He said that he was working with Trustee Christensen and Trustee Champagne on the Minoa Days Festival and it will be a little different this year. He said they were working diligently and the cost should be lower this year.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Donovan said that he would be in Albany on May 4, 2010 to meet with staff and the Attorney General's Office, Governor Patterson, Senator Samson, and Senator Klein to discuss Village concerns and unfunded mandates.

Mayor Donovan reported that Thomas Spooner had sent a letter to the Village Office thanking Clerk/Treasurer Snider for her help and hard work in helping him with an escrow account issue.

Mayor Donovan reported that the Sales Tax Agreement was scheduled for vote with the Onondaga County Legislature on May 4, 2010. He said that he and other local Mayors met with County Executive Joanie Mahoney and they were assured that the villages would not be cut from the agreement, but would be included at a reduced rate. Mayor Donovan said that funding would be possible for another 10 years and would let the Board know of the approved rate upon receipt of the final vote. Mayor Donovan said that he would send an email to the Mayors and Clerk/Treasurers thanking them for their support throughout the Sales Tax Agreement process.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Attorney Primo asked the Board if they had any further comments on the proposed Local Law #3 for 2010 entitled Internet and Communications Systems Usage and Privacy Policy. The Board did not have any further comments and/or questions.

SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING / LOCAL LAW # 3 FOR 2010 / INTERNET AND COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS USAGE AND PRIVACY POLICY

A motion was made by Trustee Cronk and seconded by Trustee Brazill to schedule a Public Hearing for Local Law # 3 for 2010 establishing a new Chapter 85 of the Village of Minoa Municipal Code entitled Internet and Communications Systems Usage and Privacy Policy on Monday, May 24, 2010 at 6:55 p.m. All in favor. Motion carried.

John Sears asked why the newsletter was being held up and Mayor Donovan said that he was responsible for the delay and would contribute his portion to the newsletter when he learned what the final decision was made on the Sales Tax Agreement so that he could address the issue.



Attorney Primo said that the Board should not act on or give approval for the building permit request until the Board has had a chance to review the code and possibly adopt a moratorium on building turbines and solar panels during the review process.

Local Law No. Two (2) of the year 2010.

A local law amending Chapter 43 of the Village of Minoa Municipal Code entitled "Annexations."

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Minoa as follows:

Section One (1). Chapter 43 of the Village Code shall be renamed and known as "Annexation of Territory."

Section Two (2). A new Article I of Chapter 43 of the Village Code shall be enacted and known as "General Provisions."

Section Three (3). A new Article II of Chapter 43 of the Village Code shall be enacted and known as "Land Annexed."

Section Four (4). Section 43-1 of the Village Code, entitled "Title", shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with a new Article I, Section 43-1 entitled "Title" with the following language:

"This Chapter 43 shall be known as "Annexation of Territory".

Section Five (5). Section 43-2 of the Village Code, entitled "Description of Territory" shall be renumbered as Article II, Section 43-3(a).

Section Six (6). A new Article I, Section 43-2 of the Village Code shall be enacted and read as follows:

§43-2. Procedures.

- A. The procedures for the annexation of territory into the Village of Minoa shall be as described at, and pursuant to, Article 17 of the General Municipal Law.
- B. All territory annexed into the Village of Minoa shall be deemed, upon annexation, as within a Residential A-1 zoning district, and subject to any further action of the Village Board of Trustees.
- C. No territory outside of the Village of Minoa shall be permitted access to or use of Village sanitary sewer, storm sewer, or water service without first being annexed into the Village of Minoa, except upon good cause shown as determined solely by the Village Board of Trustees.
- D. All territory annexed into the Village of Minoa from the effective date hereof, shall be described and listed at Article II, Section 43-3 and subsections thereof.

Section Seven (7). This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the office of the Secretary of State.






