#### NYSTRETCH ENERGY CODE 2020

Mayor Brazill presented the board with information pertaining to NY Stretch Energy Code – 2020 which call for higher efficiency standards in new and renovated building construction projects. He stated Code Enforcement officer Mike Jones attended a virtual webinar on the topic and provided the following comments:

- Cost of building new or renovating would be much higher, approximately \$20,000 additional cost to comply
- NYS is already one of the most stringent codes in USA
- Because Minoa is located in Zone 5 there are many areas of the Stretch Code that already apply.

Unanimously the board agreed they were not in favor of passing on the increased expense for complying with Stretch Code to homeowners.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN
