Local Law No. Two (2) of the year 2018.

A local law amending Chapter 110 entitled “Peddling and Soliciting” of the Village Code,

Be it enacted by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Minoa, as follows:

Section 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT

This local law amends Chapter 110 entitled “Peddling and Soliciting” of the Village Code to provide a mechanism for license suspension during the pendency of a revocation hearing required under Section 110-14.

Section 2. Section 110-14 of the Code of the Village of Minoa is hereby repealed and replaced with the following language:

110-14. Suspension / Revocation of License.

A license issued pursuant to this Chapter may be revoked after a public hearing held by the Village Board of Trustees after due notice to the licensee, or, at the option of the licensing offer, by a judicial action or proceeding. All constitutional safeguards shall be afforded the licensee at such hearing. Pending the outcome of any such revocation hearing or judicial action or proceeding, the licensing offer may, in his/her sole discretion, suspend any such license issued pursuant to this Chapter.

Section 3. Illegality/Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstances is adjudged invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such order or judgment shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or in its application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. Further, in adjudging such invalid, illegal or unconstitutional provision, the court shall attempt to modify same to a provision which is not invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and which best achieves the intent of the invalid provision.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the office of the Secretary of State.
